

## CALL FOR PAPERS

The committee invites participants to present their papers at the conference. Abstracts should be submitted online, [fkip.seminar@adm.uksw.edu](mailto:fkip.seminar@adm.uksw.edu). Presenters will be provided with a 30-minute time slot; 20 minutes should be allocated to the presentation and 10 minutes allowed for discussion.

Abstracts, in English, should not exceed 250 words, including keywords. References are not required. If you wish to include them, they must be included in the 400 word count. A brief biography (max 100 words) should be attached when submitting your abstract.

Please remember that submitting an abstract does NOT automatically register you as a conference delegate.

Full papers should be written in English and should be written in scholarly, academic format as appropriate to the content of the paper, and not exceeding 4000 words. Papers should include an abridged abstract of 250 words under the title and before the text of the paper. APA 5th/6th style for referencing should be used. The paper size should be A4, the font Times New Roman 12 and line spacing 1.5.

You give us permission to publish your abstract submission and full paper on CD Rom and online if it is accepted for presentation.

You give us permission to film or photograph your presentation at the Conference on the UKSW website, CD-Rom, in hardcopy and online.

## BACKGROUND
